Above is a rendering of our dream McDonough County Animal Shelter. Our dream can become McDonough County's reality once we raise enough funds to build. The proposed McDonough County Animal Shelter will be a 21st century facility that not only accommodates the needs of lost and homeless animals, but is also an inviting place for community members to find a new pet, volunteer, and access resources. Here's what it will be:

- The number of animals housed at the new shelter will be comparable to the current shelter capacity.
- Modern housing and lighting will enhance viewing of the animals.
- A much needed "meet and greet" area will provide opportunity to get acquainted with a potential pet in privacy and comfort for both the adopter and the dog or cat.
- Critically needed intake, quarantine, and isolation areas with efficient HVAC systems will inhibit disease spread and provide a safer and healthier environment.
- Animal drop-off kennels will be connected to the building, which will prevent bites and animals escaping when moving them into the shelter.
- Adequate office, laundry, and storage space will allow for safe handling of food, supplies, and shelter records.
- An all-purpose room will provide opportunity for education and training.

Good things come in small packages, I've been told. Anyway, I needed some special care because I had heartworms. This family with dogs and cats took me home for treatment. After a vet visit (the vet says I'm a bubble), I had to stay calm and quiet—not easy for a busy guy like me, so I spent lots of time in my kennel with a chewy toy.

It was a long time before I could be out on my own having fun, but baby, I'm back! I run all around the place unless I am under a snuggly blanket. I like my doggy playmates most of the time, though I do get a little upset if I see food around. I've been called Houdini because I am so good at opening food containers. Not a fan of Vittle Vaults, I haven't figured out how to work them. The woman says I should be a drug sniffing dog because I can sniff out the tiniest morsel of food. This seems to bother the humans, but they still love me. I am working not going to the bathroom in the house, but that is a hard thing to learn when you are 8 years old.

Did I mention I have a wonderful voice? I like to exercise it to wake up people for breakfast and again when supper is made. Oh, it is so loud and beautiful. I don't know why the people are afraid the police will come around. They would probably like my singing. The mumble something about people thinking I'm being hurt. No, I just love to sing about breakfast and supper at the top of my lungs. Life is great!

Note: Boots was a stray who was picked up and brought to the shelter, There he tested positive for heartworm. The HSMC paid for his treatment and Amy and Ken Betz fostered him during his long months of treatment and recovery. They fell in love with him and made him a permanent part of their family. He, indeed, is one lucky boy.

Hope for Hoff

How Hoff went from a sad shelter puppy to a faithful friend.

Remember Jennings (now known as Hoff) that we rescued from the shelter in October 2021 and fostered with Lars at Gossel's Dog House? After over a year's stay with Lars, Hoff has found his new best friend. He now has a new home, but still gets to go back and visit Lars and his friends at the Dog House.

Jennings' story is one of transition from an almost feral and vey "shut-down" young dog to a happy, confident, and affectionate boy. Jennings and another dog had been picked up as strays running the countryside and brought to the shelter. When his dog friend was adopted, Jennings became very depressed and totally withdrawn. We arranged for Lars to take him to Gossel's Dog House to live. Lars renamed him Hoff ("hope" in German) and gave him the space, canine companionship, time, and patience to learn to trust his surroundings and to realize that having human friends was a good thing too. Over the last few months, Hoff took a liking to Jake, a quiet, kind young man, who is an assistant at Gossel's Dog House. Instead of being stand-offish, as he had



continued to be around most people, Hoff started running to Jake when he came to work and was constantly seeking his attention. Jake adopted Hoff shortly before Christmas and now Hoff has made Jake's whole family his own.

How Your Support Helps

The Humane Society of McDonough County is a 100% volunteer organization that relies on memberships, donations, and fundraisers to support our programs that help the animals in our county. Without you, we cannot survive! We welcome you to take a look at how income was earned and expenses incurred in the 2022 calendar year.



- Restricted—Donation designate for a specific purpose, such as cat vaccines, spay/neuter, etc.
- Unrestricted—The donor lets the HSMC decide where the donation can be best spent.
- Events—Income made from events such as CatTails at Yappy Hour, Brix Challenge, etc.



- Spay/Neuter—\$35 subsidy paid for each spay/neuter of animals at the shelter; \$25 subsidy paid for each cat spayed or neutered through our transport to the Quincy Humane Society Low Cost Spay/Neuter Transport.
- Angel Fund—The three county veterinarian centers were awarded \$1,200 by us to use for emergency medical expenses.
- Shelter Cat Vaccines—The HSMC pays a veterinarian to have all cat vaccinated at the shelter.
- Rescue/Foster/Adopt—This fund supports the medical expenses and care for shelter and foster animals. We have covered Parvo and Heartworm treatments for shelter dogs, as well as surgeries and other medical assistance to all shelter pets.
- Organization/Business—These expenses include state foster licenses, tax preparation, and state non-profit fees. It also
 includes expenses such as paper, ink, envelopes, and cost of the quarterly Waggin' Tales newsletter printing and mailing.
