Greetings to Our Friends,

With COVID we've gained a greater appreciation of the benefits of fresh air, thus finding ways to share companionship and good times in the great outdoors. In September we enjoyed an incredible 7 hours of live music at the *Play It Forward* event held at the "back porch" venue of The Wine Sellers. Over \$2000 was raised for the New Animal Shelter Fund via the generosity of the local musicians who donated their tips and the participants who filled the tip jar. At the end of October we held *Bark in the Park* for the first time since 2011, this time in partnership with the Macomb Park District. With the help of great sponsorship and donations, we cleared over \$2100 for the New Animal Shelter Fund. Although it was a bit chilly, the dogs and their humans seemed to enjoy the Halloween party with its various events and contests. Pictures tell the story.

The 8th Annual Brix Challenge wrapped up earlier this month with \$18,543 raised to date to support HSMC core programs and initiatives such as low cost spay/neuter and finding homes for all adoptable shelter animals. Thanks to Chris Brix's ongoing support, this initiative solidifies our annual budget and enables us to continue to address ongoing issues related to homeless pets.

We recently rescued another dog from the animal shelter. Jennings was a very scared young boy, who was not able to let down his guard and relax in the shelter environment. Lars Gossel agreed (for what will be the sixth time) to provide a home for a HSMC foster dog. Jennings (now Hoff) is settling in to the Gossel Dog House routine and has made canine friends. He's still not sure of the need for a human connection, but he's watching and learning. We believe Lars' care and attention will win Hoff over, and help him transition into a loving pet ready to be in a forever home.

You will find evidence of the HSMC's efforts in several locations as we enter the holiday season. Christmas Trees decorated with pictures of McDonough County Animal Shelter dogs and cats and their wish lists are already up at Pet Supplies Plus and Farm King. Your gifts will make these homeless animals' holidays more festive. Bring your dogs and/or your kids to Dickens on the Square on Saturday, December 4th, between 10:00 and noon. Krista Skien Photography will be on the Courthouse lawn ready to take your holiday photos for \$10/each. Krista is donating the digital picture fee to the Humane Society. Rudy the Reindeer and few of us will be assisting Krista. Other Board members will be at Nelson's Clothing, wrapping presents on that same day, from 11:00-3:00, with John and Ian donating a percentage of sales to HSMC.

We will hold the annual reorganization vote on Board members and officers as part of our January Board meeting. The slate of proposed Board members is included in this newsletter. Jennings (aka Hoff) – now has a foster home at Gossel's Dog House

Jennings came to the shelter in early September with his running buddy Waylon (both named by the shelter staff), after being trapped by a farmer. They were a very bonded pair and shared a shelter kennel. Waylon was adopted fairly soon, leaving Jennings on his own, sad and scared. Jennings was comfortable around the other shelter dogs, but remained skittish about leaving his kennel. Neither shelter staff nor volunteers had ever encountered such a "shut-down" dog. We all agreed that he would be better off with Lars in foster care, receiving more one-on-one attention, and having room to run, a bigger area in which to live, and dogs with whom he could be buddies. The HSMC rescued him as our foster dog at the end of October and he went to Gossel's Dog House. The pictures tell the story of his transition. Hopefully over the next few weeks we will see Jennings as a trusting, self-confident, and playful boy.



2022 HSMC Sponsored Transports

Spay/Neuter for McDonough County Cats - In keeping with our initiative to combat the cat overpopulation in McDonough County, the HSMC sponsors transports to the low cost spay/neuter clinic at the Quincy Humane Society at an expense to us of \$25 per cat. In 2021 the HSMC sponsored 10 transports, resulting in 204 cats being neutered and receiving distemper and rabies vaccines. Ten transports are scheduled for 2022.
