Happy Summer Greetings,

June 4th turned out to be a very happy day when I received a phone call from the state of Virginia. I listened to the voice mail (after not responding to an unknown number), and called back immediately. A very nice woman named Gloria Caldwell Vankan talked to me about growing up in Macomb and wanting to do a match challenge for the new animal shelter in honor of her parents, Ernest and Helen Caldwell who have both passed on. Gloria, who graduated from Macomb High in 1967, and her husband will match up to \$10,000 of the donations made throughout the summer months. What makes this even more special is that both Gloria and her husband, Ed, are both are very involved in animal rescue in Virginia, currently serving as adoption counselors for the Nelson County SPCA and Hopeful Hounds of Nelson.

The timing of this offer was fortuitous. We now have the location of the new shelter building with the City of Macomb leasing the HSMC the land just east of the current shelter. A new Memo of Understanding has been signed by the County Board and the HSMC saying the HSMC will own the new shelter and lease it to the County to be the operator of the animal shelter and have sole responsibility for all costs of operation. At this time we are working to finalize the plans for the new shelter and move on to determining actual costs and a contractor for the construction. We have close to \$970,000, but are sadly aware that we will need at least \$500,000 more to make the new shelter a reality. We are hopeful that the community will respond generously to the Caldwell Vankan match challenge. It's been amazing to watch the building campaign account grow to where we can actually begin the building process. We are so thankful to all.

On another note, we are so excited about our fundraiser to support the HSMC annual budget for our initiatives. *Comedy to the Rescue* will be held July 26th at the Spoon River Outreach Center as a new version of Cat Tails at Yappy Hour. Clay Foley crosses the country helping out shelters and rescue with his comedy. He will provide some levity to our work to help needy animals find their forever homes. We will have hors d'oeuvres and wine/soft drinks available. We welcome Clay to our community and encourage you to spend the evening with us.

We hope you enjoy this edition of *Waggin' Tales* and look forward to seeing or hearing from you.




New Animal Shelter Campaign Benefits from WCIL Gives

Tears of a Clown — Cookie continues wishing and waiting and wondering why his new best friend doesn't appear.



\$10,000 Memorial Match for the New Shelter

Gloria (Caldwell) Vankan and her husband Edwin are matching funds up to \$10,000 for the new shelter building campaign in honor of her late parents, Helen and Ernest Caldwell. Ernest was a Macomb City firefighter for 28 years before retiring as captain in 1986. He passed away on Jan. 3, 2000 at the age of 75. According to Gloria, her mother, Helen, was a busy stay-at-home mom, expert upholsterer and well known for her incredible pies. She moved into Wesley Village when she was 90 and passed away Sept. 24, 2024 at the age of 95.

Gloria Caldwell-Vankan moved to Washington, D.C. shortly after she graduated from Macomb High School in 1967. She and Edwin have been volunteers for the Nelson County SPCA/Humane Society in Virginia since 2008. In 2019, the couple was honored with the annual Virginia State Federation of Humane Societies BRAVO AWARD for promoting animal welfare and being instrumental in making an impact within the animal welfare arena in the State of Virginia. The Vankans serve as adoption counselors (personally matching homeless dogs to forever homes) for the Nelson County SPCA and Hopeful Hounds of Nelson.

"We are excited to help make the dream of the Humane Society of McDonough County building a reality," the Vankans said. "My parents were good, hardworking people and I was lucky to have them as my parents. They were always kind, appreciative and generous, and they were never too busy to lend a helping hand and do what they could to better someone else's lives when they saw a need they could fulfill."

We also purchased a number of Adopt Me halters. The shelter dogs can now do some self-advertising of their adoption availability!




